MANDATORY LABEL INFORMATION

Brand Label must have:

- Brand Name
- **Class/Type Designation**
- **Appellation of Origin**
- (under certain circumstances)

MANDATORY LABEL INFORMATION

Any Label

- Bottler's (or Importer's) Name and Address
- Net Contents
- **Sulfite Declaration**
- Alcohol Content
- Health Warning Statement
- Country of Origin Statement Imports only

BRAND NAME


- Name under which the product is sold, usually the most prominent piece of information on the label.
- If there is no brand name, you may use the name of the bottler/importer if shown on the brand label
- May not create a misleading impression
- Must appear on the Brand Label





CLASS AND TYPE DESIGNATION

<u>CLASS</u>

The broad category "wine" is divided, under standards of identity, into 9 defined classes, e.g., "Grape Wine," "Aperitif Wine," "Fruit Wine" etc.

<u>TYPE</u>

Within a class, there may be several types. For example, "Table Wine" "Dessert Wine", are types of grape wine.


STANDARDS OF IDENTITY

Nine classes:

- Grape Wine
- Sparkling Grape Wine
- Carbonated Grape Wine
- Citrus Wine
- Fruit Wine

- Wine from Other Agricultural Products
- Aperitif Wine
 - Imitation or Other than Standard Wine
- **Retsina Wine**






- Name or Trade name of the Bottler/Importer as listed on the permit
 - Address (City and State) of the bottler/importer as listed on the permit

May appear on any label

NET CONTENTS


- Metric standards of fill; authorized sizes per 27 CFR 4.72
- May be on label or etched/blown into the container (which would be stated under "Special wording")
 - "ml" on containers of less than 1 liter and "L" on container of one liter or more



SULFITE DECLARATION


- N S
- Must declare if 10 ppm or more
- "Contains Sulfites"
- Statement may appear on any label
- If less than 10 ppm, may be omitted:
 - Obtain Lab Analysis
 - Submit analysis with COLA







- Appear as one statement
- Legible on contrasting background
- Separate and Apart



INCLUDES BUT NOT LIMITED TO (UNDER SPECIFIED CONDITIONS):

- Deleting nonmandatory information
- Repositioning
- Change color/font
- Percentage of blend
- Vintage date

- Change name or Trade Name to reflect a name that is listed on your permit.
- Change "Produced" to "Vinted" or "Cellared"
- Net Contents
- Alcohol Content
- Age Statement





11. Change the mandatory statement of alcohol content, as long as the change is consistent with the labeled class and type designation, and all other labeling statements.	YES	YES	YES (Flavored Malt Beverages Only)	For example, you may change the alcohol content of a grape wine labeled with a varietal designation from 13 percent to 15 percent alcohol by volume, even though it results in a change to the product's tax classification. However, if the product was designated and labeled as a "table wine," an alcohol content of 15 percent alcohol by volume would be inconsistent with the rules for use of that designation, so this change would not be permitted. Similarly, a label bearing a "rum" designation may not be changed to state an alcohol content of less than 40 percent alcohol by volume. The revised alcohol content statement must be consistent with all other mandatory or optional labeling statements.

TOP REASONS FOR CORRECTION

- Class/Type Designation is missing
- Name or Trade Name are incorrect
- Clarification Needed
- Application Omissions
- Application not submitted by the bottler

- Wrong Label uploaded
 as the Brand label
- General Misleading
- Appellation Conflict
- Class/Type info in Brand, Fanciful Name or Appellation field
- Appellation is missing
