Timeline of myTTB Services:

Foreign Producer Registration:
Register your Foreign Producer and assign CBMA tax benefits to importers.

Importer Claims:
Activate your importer entity and submit CBMA refund claims.

Export Certificates:
Generate and manage export certificates that foreign markets may require for U.S. alcohol beverages.

2024

Chemist Certification:
Submit a Chemist Certificate application.

2025

Permits:
Coming soon!

Additional services such as label and formula approvals and filing taxes will be transitioned to myTTB in the coming years!

What is myTTB?

TTB is modernizing its electronic systems to create a new seamless online platform — **myTTB** — that will transform how we deliver services. This customer-centric platform will enable industry members to securely access and manage all interactions with TTB in one place — from applying for a permit to submitting product formulas and labels to filing taxes and claims.

myTTB is designed to provide an integrated and simple user experience, incorporating feedback from industry members to include self-service tools to more efficiently and confidently comply with tax and regulatory requirements.

Phased Rollout of myTTB Services

myTTB is being developed and introduced in phases, and will gradually replace legacy systems like Permits Online, COLAs Online, and Formulas Online. The first services in myTTB are available now at my.TTB.gov — with more services coming soon.

Up Next

Get ready for **myTTB Permits** to begin rolling out this year!

Rollout for the new myTTB Permits service will begin in 2025, replacing Permits Online. This new service will offer a:

- Simplified process to apply for or amend a permit – reducing administrative burden.
- Self-service tools to manage your permit – providing faster permit updates.
- More intuitive user interface – making it easier to file and comply.

Existing Permits Online users will be asked to create a myTTB account. We will take it from there, migrating their key business entity and permit information to myTTB.

As the launch of myTTB Permits gets closer, we will share updates on TTB.gov and offer webinars to introduce the system, provide instructions on how to register for a myTTB account, and prepare users for the transition.
