Proposed Establishment of the “Los Olivos District” Viticultural Area

Washington, D.C. — The Alcohol and Tobacco Tax and Trade Bureau will publish a notice of proposed rulemaking in the Federal Register on March 3, 2015, proposing to establish the approximately 22,820-acre “Los Olivos District” American viticultural area in Santa Barbara County, California. The proposed viticultural area is located within the established Santa Ynez Valley viticultural area and the larger, multicounty Central Coast viticultural area.

TTB is making this proposal in response to a petition filed on behalf of local vintners and grape growers. TTB designates viticultural areas to allow vintners to better describe the origin of their wines and to allow consumers to better identify wines they may purchase.
