TTB Does Not Define Any of These Products

- Hard seltzer
- Hard coffee/hard tea
- Canned cocktails
- Ready to drink (RTD) beverages





TTB Considerations

- Permits
- Formulas
- Labeling
- COLAs
- Container sizes



- Obtain the appropriate permit or authorization
 - Winery
 - Brewery
 - Distilled Spirits Plant
- Apply through Permits Online
- Alternating premises
 - The premises is used by the same owner/same EIN to conduct more than one TTB-regulated business, such as a brewery and distilled spirits plant







- Generally required when you are adding coloring or flavoring materials
 - Adding carbonation to any distilled spirit requires formula approval
- Obtain before you make the product

- Apply using <u>Formulas Online</u>



Label Requirements

- TTB regulations outline:
 - What must be on the label
 - What may be on the label if you follow certain rules
 - What may not be on the label
- Products that don't fit into the standards of identity must be labeled with a truthful and adequate statement of composition



Certificates of Label Approval

- Generally, if the product will travel in interstate commerce, the bottler must get a COLA
- Obtain before bottling/canning product
- Apply using <u>COLAs Online</u>
- There are many changes you may make to previously approved labels without getting a new COLA





- Wine and distilled spirits may only be sold in the standards of fill (essentially the container sizes) listed in the regulations
- We may authorize an aggregate standard of fill based on the circumstances



Food Safety Issues

- U.S. Food and Drug Administration
 - Generally Recognized as Safe (GRAS)
- Limited Ingredients
- Intended Use
- Packaging
